Maths

In year 1 we will be learning the sequence 21-25, measure, sequencing events, to 20- adding subtracting and equality. In EYFS we will be recapping on numbers 1-5 and introducing 0. We will be exploring number bonds to 10 and looking at shape as well as discussing time in the context of our day.

Physical Development

Our focus in PE this term will be dance. we will be taking inspiration from fire dancers and moving as if we are flames. Our warm ups will be frantic attempts to put out fires.

Topic Geography

We will be exploring London and comparing it to our locality. We will use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop. Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the UK and its surrounding seas. Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West)
