YEAR R – REMOTE LEARNING TERM 6 WEEK 6

Understanding of the World/Literacy

- Look at a world map and talk about what some of the countries are and some landmarks they are famous for. Google Earth is a great resource for this on a computer!
- Decide on a country that interests you you might like a landmark from there, or some animals that live there, or you might have a connection to it! Do some research on that country and find out lots of interesting fact you would like to share with your friends.
- Write some sentences to explain what you have found out. Maybe you could print/draw some pictures to go with them.
- Can you think of an exciting way to present your findings? Maybe in a book with a fact on each page? Or, you could make an informative poster?

Maths

- Make a number line from 1 20. This could be done by ordering number cards and then sticking them down on some card, or writing the numbers in boxes. Also make some cards that say 'one more' 'one less' 'take one away' 'add one' and play games by choosing a number and then selecting a card. What is the answer?
- Have some objects which you can use for counting (such as pasta shapes). Count
 out a group of 4 and share them between 2 plates. Can this be done so it's equal?
 Try with 5 pasta shapes. Is this equal? Talk about how 4 is even and 5 is odd.
- Investigate with other amounts deciding on if an amount is odd and even. Maybe you could colour each number on your number line. One colour for odd and one for even. What do you notice?

Phonics

- Watch the tricky word song Phase 4 Tricky Words song Part A | Literacy | La La La Learn YouTube. Do two or three of the words each day, pausing then video to talk about the word, then covering the screen and practising writing it. Can you say it in a sentence? Can you write it in a sentence?
- Have a go at reading these polysyllabic words Phase 4 polysyllabic words YouTube
 Then have a go at writing them, by clapping out the syllables and doing one at a time.

Understanding of the World/Exploring Media and Materials

- Try and find some videos of music from different parts of the world. This website is a great place to start <u>World music for kids -- What you teach your kids MATTERS</u> (allaroundthisworld.com)
- Choose some of you favourite songs and talk about which instruments are making those sounds. Can you find things from around the house that make a sound similar? Maybe you could create your own short piece of music and ask an adult to record you?
