## **English**

Reading: The term starts by focusing on the text 'The boy who cried wolf.' They then move onto a big unit on the wonderful Oliver Jeffers text 'Here we are: notes for living on planet Earth' which really complements our work in Geography.

Writing: We will be applying our writing skills in lots of cross-curricular inspired writing this term. Writing non-chronological reports on Mary Anning from our History work, and different animal groups, using our scientific knowledge. We will also be doing a poetry unit, to apply all the things we learn in our World Book Day workshops.


Phonics: Year I will be looking at the alternate spellings for the sounds /s/, /j/, /l/, /m/, /n/, /sh/

Spelling: Y2 will learn spelling rules for when using the 'y' to make an /igh/ sound at the end of a word, and when adding the endings —ing, —ed, —ing, est —y

**Handwriting:** Year I - we are focusing on making sure that neat handwriting transfers from handwriting type activities into all their work in books. Year 2 - will start to learn the joins needed to join their handwriting

#### Our class texts





Mathematics The children will start term recapping addition and subtraction within 100 from last term. We will practise the strategies taught to ensure they are secure and can be used in a range of problem solving activities. We then move onto 'multiplication and division', starting with making and recognising equal and non-equal groups and moving into more specific work on 2.5 and 10 times tables.

Year 2: We will be working towards children using their knowledge of number facts to answer multiplication and division problems (2s, 5s, 10s, 3s) and applying this to problem solving tasks.

Year I: We will counting in groups of 2s, 5s, 10s, using arrays to help children visualise the equal groups involved. They will using lots of practical resources to build division + multiplication physically.

Science We will be continuing with our 'materials' unit at the beginning of term, doing an investigation into transparent, translucent and opaque. We will then be revisiting the topic of Animals, including humans. Children will be increasing their knowledge of fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, becoming confident in identifying the different animals using their defining features.

RE Our unit this term is 'Salvation' and then the children will be learning where the Easter story falls in the 'big story' of the bible. We will tell the stories of Holy Week, thinking about the symbols that are associated with it and then how Christians show their belief in Jesus through what they do at Easter.

PE This term we will be looking at both sending and receiving games and wall and net games. We will be learning different methods of throwing a ball as well as aiming and returning it. We will also focus on teamwork and sportsmanship.
