

YEAR R – REMOTE LEARNING – WEEK 3

THE BOG BABY/MOTHER'S DAY

Communication and Language + Literacy

- Listen to the description of what a Bog Baby looks like (we will send it to you over Evidence Me!) and then create your own. Use playdough or salt dough with a range of other resources to add detail.
- Introduce your Bog Baby to your family. What are its favourite foods? What food does it hate? What are its favourite activities and things to do? You could place your Bog Baby in the middle of a piece of paper and write your ideas around the outside.
- Take your Bog Baby on an adventure around your house and take photographs of them as they explore. You can then use the photographs to make a book about your Bog Baby's adventures. Can you write a simple sentence for each of the photographs?

Maths

- Collect a range of natural materials from outside – leaves, stones, sticks etc. Arrange them in different ways. Can you subitise (recognise an amount without counting) any amounts within the arrangement?
- Make a collection of up to 10 objects (small world animals/toy trains/little figures) and talk about the fact that they are the 'whole'. Experiment with different ways of grouping them into 'parts', talking about the choices you are making in grouping them together.

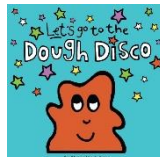
Phonics

- Recap all of the sounds on your letter fans, practising the actions as well as the pronunciations.
- Pick one or two of the sounds (maybe ones you are unsure of) and go on a sound hunt around your house/outside. What objects can you find that have those sounds in the words?
