FRENCH: Children will continue to study elements of French culture. They will practise how to greet and say goodbye in different ways. Children will continue to learn about school in France and describe the rooms. equipment and activities you may find there. Children will learn the names of some French clothes and how to describe these using colours.

P.E.: Children will develop their ball skills through refining specific techniques and applying them in a range of ball games. MATHS: Children will learn about

algebra, finding one-step and twostep rules, forming expressions, substitution, formulae and forming equations. They will begin to solve one and two-step equations. Children will learn about ratio. fractions and using scale factors. They will solve ratio and proportion problems. Children will study statistics, learning how to draw and interpret line graphs and pie charts. They will find the mean of groups.

ENGLISH: Children will study the book "The Journey" and use this to develop their writing skills. They will focus on using a wide range of grammatical devices and authorial techniques as well as accuracy of spelling and handwriting. Children will complete their study by writing an independent narrative using the skills learned. Children will also study the text "Scott of the Antarctic" and learn the features of a non-fiction diary. They will learn how to develop the use of vocabulary and structure within this.

READING: Children will study a range of books and learn to analyse them. They will express their understanding verbally and in writing.

SPELLING: Children will refine their understanding of spelling



SCIENCE: Children will study properties and changes of materials. They will learn to name and understand the three states of matter and how particles behave within solids, liquids and gases. Children will learn to take accurate measurements using a data-logger and a thermometer. They will plan a scientific enquiry and report and present findings including conclusions, causal relationships and explanations.

Oak Class – Curriculum Map – Term 4

HISTORY: Children will continue learning about The Tudors. They will study key events of the period such as the Battle of Bosworth and the defeat of the Spanish Armada. Children will learn about Tudor entertainment and how this differs from those we enjoy today.

COMPUTING: Children will learn about the features of coding and how to use these features to create a program that responds to commands.

Art: The children will continue to learn about great Expressionist artists. They will improve their mastery of art and design techniques including painting and analyse how these were used in paintings. Children will focus on the artist Henri Matisse and produce artwork in the style of both his paintings and his collage work.

> R.E: Children will learn about Parables of The Bible.
