Year 5 and 6 Autumn Term 1

English

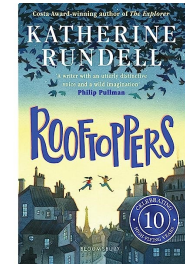
Our reading text will be *Rooftoppers* by Katherine Rundell. Set in Victorian times, the protagonist, Sophie, escapes her orphanage and journeys to Paris to find her missing mother—who was shipwrecked. The book explores the idea that anything is possible with enough love and determination.

In writing, our first topic will be Autobiographies. After studying the model text, children will sequence and describe events chronologically and factually, whilst using conjunctions, prepositions and adverbs to express time, place and cause.

Our next unit will be discursive writing and speeches. Within this unit, the children will learn to use the passive voice to convey a formal tone and know that multiple viewpoints need to be represented within a discussion. They will then be writing, editing and delivering their own speeches.

The final unit this term is war poetry. We will be identifying structure and how figurative language can be used to enhance images for the reader. The children will then perform a poem using intonation, volume and movement.

Mathematics

Y5

Place value: roman numerals; writing and reading numbers to 1,000,000; powers of 10; using numberlines; partitioning numbrs and rounding to the nearest 10, 100, 1000.

Adding & Subtracting: mental strategies; adding and subtracting numbers up to 4 digits; multi step problems and comparing calculations.

Multiplication & Division: multiples; factors; prime numbers; squared and cubed numbers and multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, 1000.

Y6

Place value: numbers to 10,000,000; powers of 10; using numberlines; comparing and ordering; rounding numbers and using negative numbers.

Four operations: addition & subtraction; factors & multiples; rules of divisibility; multiply a 4 digit number by a 2 digit number; short and long division.; mental calculations and problem solving

Science

Our topic this term is electricity. Within this unit we will be learning about what electricity is and how it works, understanding the vocabulary of electrons, neurons and protons. We will learn to identify, draw and use the components needed to make a series circuit. We will have the opportunity to put these into practice while using practical equipment. We will then look at the effects and consequences of changing component equipment—what will happen to the flow of electrons within an open and closed circuit?

Computing

We will develop their understanding of computer systems and how information is transferred between systems and devices.

History

The Autumn Term will be focusing on our topic of The Battle of Britain. Within this we will analyse what started the war, how it affected British people, including children, looking specifically at rationing and evacuation. We will also be extending our knowledge and get the chance to look at some artefacts, with a planned class trip to London's Imperial War Museum.

PSHE

Our first topic will be based around family and relationships. We will discuss friendship issues, how to resolve conflict, being respectful, consequences of stereotyping and ways to deal with change and loss.

Art-Drawing

We will be using cut fruit to use as a stimulus to practice our pencil sketching and use of charcoal. We will also be looking at the artist Frida Kahlo and symbolism, before learning how ratio and proportion are used to draw faces.

RE

This term in RE we are looking at creation. We are thinking about what Genesis 1 might mean and comparing how Christians interpret it. We will consider whether science and faith go together.



PE

This term we are starting with our Swimming lessons, which will once again be taking place at Homewood House on a Friday Morning.

Geography

Our topic for Autumn term will be Earthquakes, Mountains, and Volcanoes. Within this we will learn about what makes up the layers of the earth, as well as what tectonic plates are, where we find them, how they move and what happens when they do.

Music

This term we will be learning to sing "Happy" by Pharell Williams and playing instrumental parts within the song. We will be learning musical vocabulary to appraise and respond to music.

DT-Food technology

We will learn the culinary skills required to make burritos, pitta breads and hummus and samosas. We will look at the nutritional value of food and how foods and flavours vary depending on cultures.

Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)

Our topic this term will be 'Our Town'. We will learn to identify and say vocabulary for buildings and services usually found in towns. Children will also learn to describe their own town in Spanish. We will extend our counting to say multiples of ten.
