Welcome

It's been a while since we last updated you on PTA news. The summer term has been quite busy! We approached Easter with the children at school doing their sponsored bunny hop in the pouring rain. Despite the miserable weather, our wonderful children achieved something amazing by raising £1,510 in sponsorship. Extreme weather has continued to impact some of our popular events, with pouring rain or sweltering heat.

The PTA is extremely grateful for the support from the parent community this academic year. 

Gardening Sessions

The first session was cancelled due to bad weather, but a few families joined on May 20. We did a great job weeding the vegetable beds. Reception pupils have been enjoying mange tout sown in the February session, and they even shared a carrot during snack time. Courgettes are growing well, and feeding some of the staff team; tomatoes are progressing, but it will be a couple of weeks until they ripen. We've seen pretty summer flowers, including leucanthemum and cosmos sown by the children. If butterflies don't interfere, we might have purple sprouting broccoli next spring.

Penshurst & Cowden Fetes

The PTA had stands at Penshurst village fete and Cowden fete. We showcased our new "hook-a-duck" kit, a remarkable creation by Kayleigh King, mother of Jacob in Reception. The children also led biscuit decorating and slime-making activities. The candy floss machine delighted the audience at Penshurst, just like on Bonfire Night. Both events faced challenging weather conditions, with high temperatures at Penshurst and a thunderstorm at Cowden. However, they highlighted the sense of community that village life embodies, and it was wonderful to involve the school children in leading activities.
