Pupils with SEND or Long-Term Medical Conditions

- Staff training and CPD to support inclusive PE and sport delivery
- Extra-curricular and competitive opportunities for SEND pupils
- Top-up swimming lessons for pupils needing additional support
- Peer-to-peer activities promoting inclusion and teamwork

Increasing Girls' Access to Sport

- Specialist activities and clubs designed for girls

The school reports:

- Increased physical activity levels among all pupils
- Greater participation in inter-school and extra-curricular competitions
- Improved staff capability to deliver inclusive PE lessons
- Enhanced attainment in swimming and water safety

5. Swimming and Water Safety

Year 6 Swimming Outcomes (2024–2025):

- 77% of pupils can swim competently and confidently over 25 metres
- 77% can use a range of strokes effectively (front crawl, backstroke, breaststroke)
- 92% can perform safe self-rescue in water-based situations

Investment in top-up swimming (£5,000) contributed directly to these outcomes, ensuring pupils develop life-saving skills.

The school's investment in staff development, inclusive programmes, and peer-led initiatives ensures the continuity of these positive outcomes. Building staff capacity and community partnerships will sustain the benefits of the PE and Sport Premium long-term.
