## **Remote Learning Parent Questionnaire/Information**

The main scenarios that could mean that your child has to remain at home during the current Covid19 pandemic are:

- A pupil has to self-isolate as they display Covid19 symptoms and they are awaiting test results.
- A member of a child's family displays symptoms of Covid19 and are awaiting test results (all members of the household must self-isolate). Members of any support bubble must also self-isolate.
- A child tests positive for Covid19 and has to self-isolate for 10 days from the start of the symptoms or 10 days from the date of the positive test if they are symptom free. Pupils should not return to school until they are symptom free.
- A member of a child's household (or support bubble) tests positive then the child must self-isolate for 14 days.
- The child has been the close contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid19; they have been contacted by NHS Test & Trace and advised to self-isolate for 14 days
- The school has to close a bubble due to a child or a member of staff having tested positive for Covid19.

When a pupil is feeling well and in one of these situations, they should continue to engage in learning at home. Our remote learning policy, activities and timetable are all available on our website.

However, I appreciate for some families they may face challenges if any of the above situations affect them.

The purpose of this letter is to help us to gauge the levels of support in terms of human and physical resources you may need if any of the above situations arise. Where we can, and it is appropriate, we will do our best to provide support to our families.

Please could you provide us with the following information so that we can review the needs of our school community. Mrs Gammer will shortly be creating a ParentMail form for you to provide the information electronically, please could you complete the form by 9am on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> November.
