A selfie can....

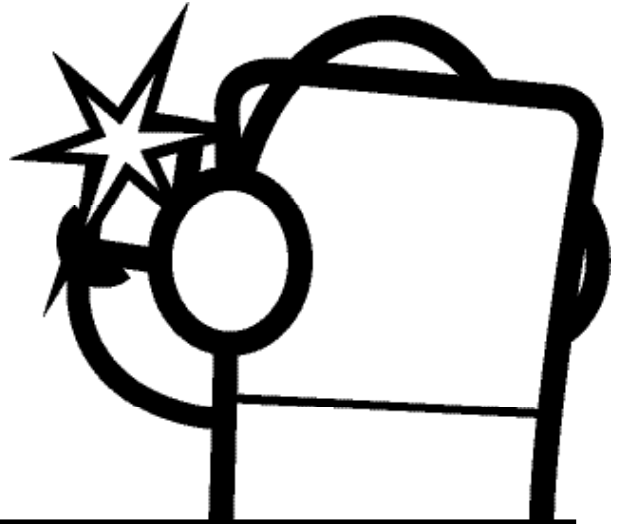
- reveal your location
